1] Say 'Hello'

- a) to a friend
- b) to a friend you haven't seen for 3 years
- c) to a neighbour that you don't like
- d) to a 6-month-old baby
- e) to someone you have just found doing something they shouldn't
- f) to someone on the phone when you're not sure if they are still on the other end

'Goodbye'

- a) to a member of your family as they are going through the boarding gate at the airport
- b) to someone who has been annoying you
- c) to a child starting his very first day at school

'How are you?'

- a) to someone you haven't seen for 20 years
- b) to someone who has recently lost a member of the family
- c) to someone who didn't sleep in their own bed last night

'I never go to pubs'

- a) by a person that totally disapproves of drinking alcohol to someone who often goes to pubs
- b) as a response to someone who has told you they sometimes go to pubs said before: '**Don't SAY, just MEAN this second part:** (but I quite like discos).'

'What have you done?'

- a) to someone who claims to have fixed your television only that now it's worse than before
- b) to someone who is scolding you for not doing anything when you suspect the same about them.
- c) to someone who has just done something very bad and which has serious consequences

2] TRUTH OR LIE?

Each student has three or four questions to answer (see below); the others take turns to ask the student questions to find out if the student is telling the truth. Each student decides whether to give true answers or not; the student answering the question must always answer '**Yes I have,**' regardless of whether what they're saying is TRUE or NOT TRUE!

The other students have to ask questions to find out if the student is telling the truth or lying. Obviously, sometimes they'll be telling the truth, sometimes, they won't. At a certain point, the teacher says: 'No further questions', now everyone writes 'True' or 'False' next to the question that was asked, e.g., Hilde Question b) False. **When a student has been asked all their particular questions have, the true answers are read out by each student, i.e., Question a) TRUE, question b) FALSE etc. The student who guessed whether the student was lying or telling the truth correctly the most is the winner.**

A typical series of questions and answers might be something like:

- Have you ever swum naked in the sea?
 - Yes, I have.
 - Where did you do it?
- Erm. On holiday in Majorca.
- Who were you with?
 - Some friends.
- What were their names?
- Erm...etc.

ASK ME Have you ever spoken to a famous person? Where were you? How did you meet him or her? Who was it? Etc. etc.
