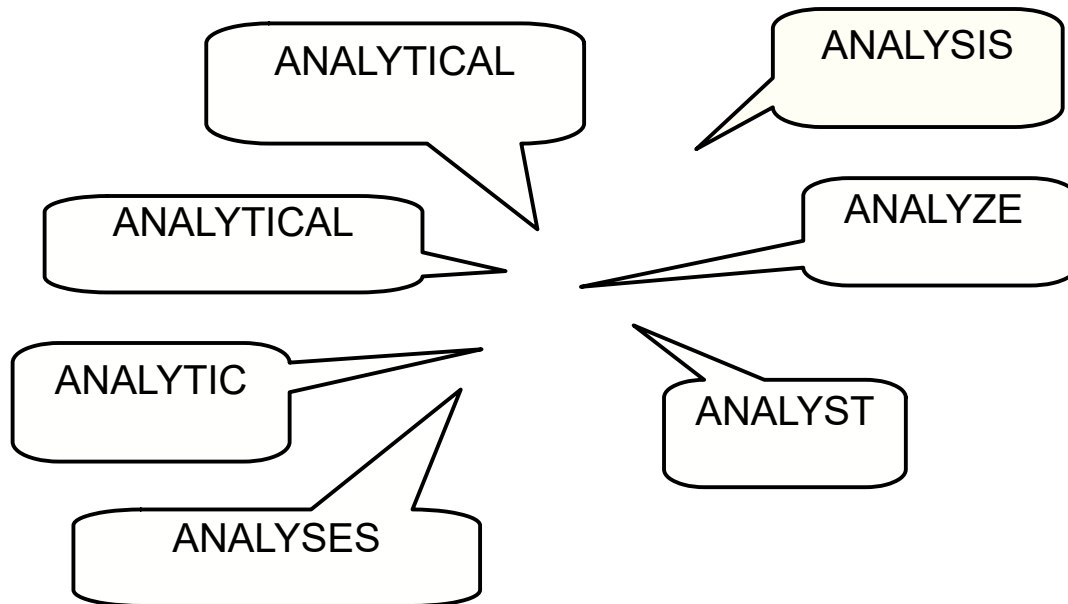


WORD FAMILIES
